We have some

After being unable to field a Junior High Softball team the past two years the district has decided to offer volleyball in place of softball for our junior high girls. We look forward to the volleyball season and cheering on our Lady Mustangs this fall.

While our students have been enjoying summer vacation, we have or soon will accomplish many things: installed Fire Safety systems in both buildings, updated restrooms in both buildings, refinished the gym floor in Hopkins, painted rooms in both buildings, replaced our kitchen walk-in cooler,

updated HVAC in both building, purchased a new bus, and resurfaced the Hopkins parking lot.

# Elementary Back-to-School Information

## Elementary Registration

Elementary registration for all students, preschool through fifth grade, will be held Wednesday, August 2nd and Thursday, August 3rd, from 8:00 am – 6:00pm. All elementary families will be required to bring an address verification such as a rental contract, real estate contract, utilities bill/deposit receipt, or other documents

such as payroll check, driver's license, or W-4. Also, please remember to bring along any emergency phone numbers as two emergency contacts are required. If you are enrolling a student new to our district, in addition to the above items, please be sure to bring a copy of their birth certificate, Social Security card, and immunization record.

## Preschool Registration

Just a reminder to parents of all students who will enter Preschool that registration will be held at the same time as the elementary registration on Wednesday, August 2nd and Thursday, August 3rd from 8:00 am – 6:00pm. Also, please remember to bring along two emergency phone numbers and 911 addresses as these

are required. There are forms in addition to the forms filled out last spring which must be completed and turned in at this time. If you have not already done so, please bring your child's Social Security card, birth certificate, immunization record and medical exam. These are required before your child may attend Preschool.

## 2017-2018 Missouri School Immunization Requirements

• All students must present documentation of up-to-date immunization status, including month, day, and year of each immunization before attending school. • The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) allows a 4-day grace period. Students in all grade levels may receive immunizations up to four days before the due date. • For children beginning kindergarten during or after the 2003-04 school year, required immunizations should be administered according to the current Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices Schedule, including all spacing, (<http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/index.html>). • To remain in school, students “in progress” must have an Immuni-

zation In Progress form (Imm.P.14), which includes the appointment date for needed immunizations, on file and must receive immunizations as soon as they become due. The student is in compliance as long as he/she continues to receive the appropriate immunization(s) at the correct intervals according to the ACIP recommendations. In progress means that a child has begun the vaccine series and has an appointment for the next dose. This appointment must be kept and an updated record provided to the school. If the appointment is not kept, the child is no longer in progress and is noncompliant. (i.e., Hep B vaccine series was started but the child is not yet eligible to

receive the next dose in the series.) • Religious (Imm.P.11A) and Medical (Imm.P.12) exemptions are allowed. The appropriate exemption card must be on file. Unimmunized children are subject to exclusion from school when outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases occur.  
 1. Last dose on or after the fourth birthday and the last dose of pediatric pertussis before the seventh birthday. Maximum needed: six doses.  
 2. 8-12 Grades: Tdap, which contains pertussis vaccine, is required. If a student received a Tdap, the student is up-to-date. Tdap is currently licensed for one dose only; an additional dose is not needed.  
 3. Grade 8-9: One dose of MCV is required. Dose

must be given after 10 years of age. Grade 12: Two doses of MCV are required unless the first dose was administered to a student who was 16 years of age or older, in which case only one dose is required. At least one dose must be given after 16 years of age.  
 4. Kindergarten-7 Grade: Last dose must be administered on or after the fourth birthday. The interval between the next to-last and last dose should be at least six months.  
 8-12 Grades: Last dose on or after the fourth birthday. If all four doses are administered appropriately and received prior to the fourth birthday, an additional dose is not needed. Any combination of four doses of IPV and OPV by four, six years of age consti-

tutes a complete series. Maximum needed: four doses.  
 5. First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age.  
 6. First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age.  
 Kindergarten-7 Grade: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a licensed health care provider may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease.  
 8-12 Grades: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a parent/guardian or MD or DO may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease.
